NIMALS AND FIBERS AT THE FAIR

Of course, we use all kinds of fibers in our work, but a large percentage of our work is done with animal fiber. We have wished for animals to be a part of the Fair since the very first year, but we were not located anywhere where animals were welcome until 2010, when we moved to the Lake County Fairgrounds.

We work to expand our animal presentation every year. Last year we had the largest llama shorn-fleece competition in the country! This year we are having our first ILR-sanctioned llama show. We welcome our furry friends!

THREE BAGS FULL SHORN FLEECE COMPETITION AND SALE



Begun in 2011, the Three Bags Full Fleece Competition & Sale has three goals:

- 1) To provide feedback and a market for our fleece producers
- 2) To provide top quality fleeces for our spinners
- 3) To inform the public about different animals and breeds, the fleeces they produce, and uses for different types of wool

There are three divisions: Sheep, Llama, and Alpaca, and three awards per class. We've got THE best cash awards for fleece in the country! Grand Champion receives \$125, and Reserve Champion receives \$100 (each division). Join us Friday morning at 10AM to watch the judging. Our judges will talk about the fleeces and educate the public about how to pick a fabulous fleece! Afterward, you can purchase your favorite fleece (or three). They may even be award-winning!

Our judges this year are: Division I Sheep: Neil Kentner; Division II Llama & Division III Alpaca: Mary Jo Miller. This year you will find the Fleece Competition at the very front of the Fair. Special thanks to The Fold and Animal Acres Llamas for organizing the whole thing!

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
